## The Pill Rut

Is it possible to not be healed? I'm thinking about this question because I told someone the other day that I would pray for them. They didn't ask me to pray. They are fine with their condition. They've been diagnosed with a condition that is treatable with a drug that they will have to take for the rest of their life. The condition has to do with their mental and emotional state of mind.

This Christian didn't ask me not to pray. I assume they would prefer not to have to take a pill every day.

I wonder if Jeremiah would have said to God upon this same diagnosis, "Heal me, O Lord." Had he prayed that would he have followed by declaring, "and I shall be healed."

We Americans have developed a mindset that expects pills. We don't endure them. It doesn't even occur to us that God's healing should be sought before we settle into the lifetime pill rut. And that the healing we seek should be expected ... "I shall be healed."

These mood altering pills can be quite expensive. That doesn't change our perception or expectation. It should. Money is a measure of time. We should expect to "spend" our time in a non-drug dependent state of mind.

The letter of James addresses the issue, "Is any among you afflicted? let him pray. Is any merry? let him sing psalms. Is any sick among you? let him call for the elders of the church; and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord: And the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up; and if he have committed sins, they shall be forgiven him. Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much."

The pill my friend is taking corrects something only pharmaceutical companies are equipped to address. It doesn't occur to my Christian friend that it would be appropriate to call on the elders for this condition. He is a Christian. He doesn't think of himself as "sick." His condition has nothing to do with sin, he thinks.

Is he right to think that way? Sin is often connected with the need for healing in the Bible. Does this apply to the man in the mood altering pill rut? Just askin ...

In the verses prior to his admonition to pray for healing the writer of James commands, "Now listen, you rich people, weep and wail because of the misery that is coming on you. Your wealth has rotted, and moths have eaten your

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clothes. Your gold and silver are corroded. Their corrosion will testify against you and eat your flesh like fire. You have hoarded wealth in the last days. Look! The wages you failed to pay the workers who mowed your fields are crying out against you. The cries of the harvesters have reached the ears of the Lord Almighty. You have lived on earth in luxury and self-indulgence. You have fattened yourselves in the day of slaughter. You have condemned and murdered the innocent one, who was not opposing you."

What will eat your flesh like fire, according to James? The corrosion of hoarded wealth.

I agree with Bernie Sanders and the Left about the wealth gap. This doesn't make his murder of babies and promotion of sodomy any less evil. It simply means he is right about the glaring wickedness of the West's perversion of the free market. Americans are too much the beneficiary of this global greed.

We willfully moved our factories to other nations so that we could enjoy plenty without having to labor for it. "Your gold and silver are corroded."

Christians are not bereft of consolation in their perseverance and suffering. They trust God, and prayerfully join together in expectation of healing.

I'm going to continue to pray for my friend. I think he wants out of the pill rut, he just doesn't know it yet. The West's dependence on supposedly scientific responses to "sickness" is unreasonable. Our ignorance of sin's reality and effects is indefensible. The Judge of eternity doesn't look kindly on our willful ignorance.
