The forces controlling our civilization have convinced most of us that religion can be good for you if you treat it like Aladdin's genie. Keep it bottled up and let it out only three times in your life — when you're a child and you submit yourself to an initiation rite like baptism, marriage and then your funeral.

Otherwise than that religion must exist far in the background of our lives providing sentimental elevator music when called upon. This is a lie because while that may make for good psychology it has nothing to do with religion. Christianity, and indeed all religions, are encompassing. They make universal demands. All religions offer an existence, a life, that goes deeper than the world. Religion isn't an explanation. It is an eternal life.

It is a narrative into which the individual goes. It is not a narrative that the individual gets to create for himself. This might be the American Dream, but that has nothing to do with the religious urge. No, religion calls a person out of himself. Every religion calls the individual on to a divine path, an eternal quest for virtue.

For a time America wore Christ's harness. We submitted to the gospel ... the Ten Commandments.
